The Government of Malawi has applied for financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the implementation of a new ICT Project “**Digital Malawi Program Phase I: Digital foundations Project**”, and intends to apply part of the proceeds for consulting services.

The consulting services (“the Services”) include provision of technical input and supervisory support to the implementation of telecom connectivity, Government data center also known as Government cloud, Government digital applications and other project activities relating to ICT infrastructure and services from conception to implementation, testing and commissioning, and operations. The DTS will be recruited for an initial period of three years renewable annually subject to performance. This is a full time position. The DTS will be expected to commence providing the services on 1st July, 2018 subject to approval of the Project.

The Public Private Partnership Commission (PPPC) now invites eligible individuals (“Consultants”) to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The shortlisting criteria are:

- a) Should have a Master’s degree in Computer Science, Management Information Systems, Telecommunications or the equivalent supported by a Bachelor’s degree in a related field
- b) Demonstrate having at least ten years of relevant hands-on experience in managing high value ICT projects. A mixed portfolio comprising telecommunications, information technology infrastructure and services, and digital applications will be an added advantage.
- c) Should demonstrate having verifiable trail of consistent successful project implementation.

- d) Should demonstrate having a comprehensive knowledge of business principles and management practice.
- e) Should demonstrate having experience in public sector administration including procurement regulations under the local legislative framework and the World Bank regulations.

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank's "Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers" July 2016 Revised November 2017 ("Procurement Regulations"), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the Individual (INDIV) selection method set out in the Procurement Regulations.
